Course Content

Lesson 1: Introduction to Zero Waste

Introduces concept, outlines aspects of ZW management and planning, and how it can be applied to your community or organization

Lesson 2. What's in the waste stream and who's generating it?

Addresses need to understand your waste stream and from where it's generated as a critical step to ZW planning and management

Lesson 3: Upstream, Midstream, Downstream

Addresses the importance of pre-consumer decisions, consumer behaviors, and policies on the waste stream

Lesson 4: Collections Infrastructure

Addresses the collection of recovered materials generated from residential and commercial properties.

Lesson 5: Processing Technology Options

Addresses the processing of recovered materials as an essential step between collection and marketing

Lesson 6: Managing the Organics Stream

Discusses the role organic waste plays in a ZW management plan and how to manage these wastes

Lesson 7: Challenging Venues and Materials

Addresses how to communicate your ZW goals in a way that is accepted by your community

Lesson 9: Financing and Funding the Zero Waste Program

Addresses how to identify sources of funding for Zero Waste Programs.

Builds on strategies to develop a ZW system provided in previous lessons and provides information on how to incorporate the strategies into contracts and partnerships


