

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






County of San Diego Population = 3.3 million people / 18 Cities in the County

City of San Diego Population (largest) = 1.4 million people



- Collection service since 1919
- City forces currently collect from 300,000 single-family residential properties
- No service fee charged to customers due to People's Ordinance law from 1919


Where does trash go?

Three Landfills in our region.

Miramar Landfill is:

- Operated by the City
- Centrally located
- Estimated to close by 2028







Miramar Landfill Design





- Liner and Leachate Collection System
- Landfill gas Collection System
- Feeds co-generation engines for energy

Commercial Compost Facility

- 75 Acres at Miramar Landfill
- Quality mulch, compost, woodchips
- Recycles over 105,000 tons/year
 - o 7,500 tons = food
 - o 3,500 tons = wood
 - o Remainder = greens

City Recycling Ordinance (CRO) - 2008








- Targets all commercial, industrial, multi-family properties and permitted special events
- Enforcement mechanism




Construction & Demolition Ordinance - 2008







What is in Our Trash?



Approximately 75% of this material could be diverted by Reducing, Reusing, Recycling & Composting

Local City of San Diego Ordinances City Recycling Ordinance (CRO) 2008

All single family, multi-family, commercial and industrial properties, and permitted special events must divert their recyclable materials. Education component for all commercial and multi-family properties as well.

Construction & Demolition Debris Deposit Program (2008)

Requires majority of construction, demolition and remodeling projects to divert their debris by reuse, donating, or recycling materials (think concrete, asphalt, wood, metals, etc.)

Zero Waste Plan (2015)

Lays out a plan to divert 75% of City's waste by 2020 and 100% by 2040.

Climate Action Plan (2015)

Calls for eliminating half of all greenhouse gas emissions in the City and aims for all electricity used in the City to be from renewable sources by 2035.

Polystyrene Foam and Single Use Plastics Ordinance (2019)

Elimination of polystyrene foam and single use plastic products from the City. Currently on hold due to litigation.

Zero Waste

"Zero Waste is a principle that calls for handling discarded materials as commodities for reuse rather than for disposal, and conserving those commodities through waste prevention, recycling, composting and other technologies."



- Polystyrene foam (Styrofoam)
 products for the use of food
 service ware, fish and meat
 trays, egg cartons, coolers, and
 beach toys
- Plastic and bio-plastic straws and utensils
